#### STEELE YOURSELVES, WE'VE A JOB TO DO

Do you like "Remington Steele"? Judging from the mail we have received, the answer is a resounding "YES"! You'd like to see it back on next season, right? Well, you can do something about it. Contrary to popular opinion, there are other criteria for keeping programs on the air besides the Nielson ratings. One of those things is letters from the people who have been watching the program.

Right now, NBC is tottering on the brink of a decision on "Remington Steele". To renew or not to renew? That's their question. We already know the answer. So now is the time to help poor NBC make up its mind. We propose that you use the most valuable weapon that you have, you write to NBC corporate headquarters, to your local station and to MTM Enterprises. You should write them honestly, tactfully, intelligently and with feeling. You tell them what you like, why you want the show to continue. You tell them how you feel. All these letters should be written in the most professional manner that you can muster. We think that this should be a good, classy effort, something worthy of the character of Steele. That's not to say that you have to put on a tux or evening gown to write the letter, but you get my drift. In order for NBC and MTM to pay attention to us, we must be sure that the letters that we send are legible and readable. Type them, if possible. You all have excellent ideas and given some thought, you are eminently capable of turning out a terrific. letter that will make them sit up and take notice. Always keep in mind that you hold tremendous power that you never even think about. YOU CAN GET UP AND TURN THE CHANNEL! Truly an awesome capability when considered by the network. Now we have some additional information that is very important and has a bearing on this situation.

On March 27, 1984, "Remington Steele" will air an episode in which the guest star is Pierce's wife, Cassandra Harris. This episode, called "Woman of Steele", promises to be a wonderful one. No guest star in a previous episode has had such a large role. The plot? Well, possibly to quote Remington himself, "Alfred Hitchcock's "VERTIGO", starred James Stewart and Kim Novak..." Get the picture (oops, excuse the pun!)

We think the timing for this letter campaign should coincide with the airing of this special episode. So, be ready to pounce on March 28. 


